**TEACHING SUGGESTIONS** 

#### SETTING THE STAGE

**Echo say** the selection title and composer name while viewing the Composer Portrait and Wall Sign.

Read or listen to background information on M. Monk (b. 1942) and this selection.

Introduce the concept of a *motif*.

- Explain that composers can use repetition to help create patterns in music. The composer picks a melody or rhythm and repeats it throughout the song. This repetition ties the music together and makes it easier for listeners to recognize. Composers also use different patterns and change them just a little bit each time to keep the music interesting.
- **Define** the concept of *motif* as a recurring short musical idea.

Tell students that today they will be listening to a piano selection that uses motifs.



#### **Description of the Painting:**

**<u>Time Transfixed</u>** by René Magritte is a surprising painting. The train coming out of the fireplace is represented as if it were coming out of a railway tunnel. The painting has unrelated objects and the scale is totally disconnected from reality. This is called the surrealist style of painting.


#### Short Biography of the Artist:

René Magritte was born on November 21, 1898, in Lessines, Belgium. He is one of the most famous surrealist painters, known for creating strange and imaginative art. As a child, he loved comic strips but had a tough life, losing his mother when he was young. Magritte painted his first picture in 1914 and later studied art in Brussels.


#### How the Painting Relates to the Music:


René Magritte's painting *Time Transfixed* and Meredith Monk's song *Railroad (Travel Song)* both explore the mystery and wonder of trains. In the painting, a train is coming out of a fireplace, blending something ordinary with something magical. Similarly, Monk's piece uses the sound of a piano to capture the feeling of traveling on a train, full of rhythm and movement. Both the painting and the music make us think about the excitement and dream-like quality of journeys.



Characters: Teacher, Justin, Christina Setting: A School Classroom

Teacher: Today, we'll learn about an incredible woman composer, Meredith Monk, and her fascinating piece, *Railroad (Travel Song)*.

Justin: Who is Meredith Monk?

Teacher: Meredith Monk is a groundbreaking composer, singer, and performer. She's famous for creating music that's different from anything you've heard before.

Christina: Is she like Beethoven or Mozart?

Teacher: Yes, she composes music to be enjoyed by performers and listeners. But she is different in that she is still alive today, and composes in a style called *Minimalism*.

Justin: *Minimalism*? What's that?

Teacher: It's music that uses simple patterns, repeated and layered, to create something beautiful and unique.

Christina: This piece is for only one instrument, the piano, correct?

Teacher: Yes, she wrote a small amount of melodic material and repeated patterns that the pianist performs to create sounds like a train!

Justin: Wait—*a train*?

Teacher: That's where *Railroad (Travel Song)* comes in. Monk used the piano to create the feeling of a train journey—clicking wheels, the whistle, and the rhythm of travel.

Christina: That's so creative!

Teacher: And inspiring. Meredith Monk shows us how women composers can push boundaries and create music that takes us on a journey – only one instrument needed!

All Characters: Let's listen to Railroad (Travel Song) and imagine the journey!



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
